

EtonHouse launches scholarships for Cambridge IGCSE and IB Diploma worth SGD 1.9 million per year

Singapore, May 2018 – From this year, the EtonHouse International Education Group will disburse up to 16 full scholarships a year. These scholarships are open to Singaporeans and expatriates keen to attend secondary and high school at EtonHouse.

The scholarship is for entry into Years 9 and 10 for 2018 and Year 12 for 2019. Local secondary students who want to pursue an IB Diploma instead of the A Levels in junior colleges are encouraged to apply for this scholarship.

This grant fully covers application fees, capital levy and school fees throughout the duration of the course. This amounts to an estimated \$33,000 per year for students coming in at age 13 or 14 for the Cambridge IGCSE and continuing for 5 years, and \$37,000 per year for the 16-year-olds preparing for the IB over 2 years.

There are two entry points for this scholarship this year:

- 1. Students at Year 9 and Year 10 who are preparing for their Cambridge IGCSE examinations in Year 11
- 2. Students in Year 12 preparing for the IB Diploma in Year 13

EtonHouse Orchard is an IB Diploma candidate school. The candidacy period will formally begin on 1 September 2018. During candidacy, EtonHouse International School Orchard will work towards the fulfillment of the requirements for authorisation as an IB World School.

There is a maximum of eight scholarships per batch of students. EtonHouse intends to give out the same number of scholarships for the foreseeable future. The total amount of scholarship funding available per year is in excess of \$1.9 million.

The scholars will enrol in the new EtonHouse International School campus on Orchard Road that offers programmes from Year 1 to 13. To maintain the scholarship, they are expected to exhibit exemplary behaviour, maintain a minimum predicted grade A for Cambridge IGCSE or a minimum 6 per subject at IB Diploma. They should also actively contribute to the school and the immediate community.

Students keen on the scholarship can send in their applications from now till June 2018. Prospective candidates and their parents will then be shortlisted and invited for an interview with the selection committee. They can expect to hear results within two months from the date of application.

The purpose of the scholarship is to give back to society and nurture excellence within the community – whether expatriates or Singaporeans.

Ng Yi Xian, Executive Director at EtonHouse International Education Group, said "We strongly believe that every child should have access to world-class education and this scholarship is our way of reinforcing that. We hope that this will encourage meritocracy and nurture excellence amongst

students who can then go ahead and make meaningful contributions to society. It has been our intention to do this and we are now fortunate to have an excellent platform in our Orchard campus to be able to do so for secondary and high school students."
