Reggio Children and EtonHouse Forge Collaborations in China and Singapore

Singapore, November 20, 2023 – EtonHouse International Education Group is proud to announce its collaboration with Reggio Children in Singapore and China. The agreement makes EtonHouse the reference point for Reggio Children in these countries, reinforcing its commitment to high quality early childhood education.

This milestone will be announced formally at the Reggio Emilia conference in Shanghai in November 2023. Held for the first time in Shanghai, this eagerly anticipated conference will attract in excess of 500 delegates from all over the world and distinguished speakers from the renowned Diana school in Reggio Emilia in Italy.

The President of Reggio Children, Cristian Fabbi will address the delegates and share his thoughts and insights on this collaboration.

This is a momentous occasion as EtonHouse schools have been strong advocates and practitioners of this globally acclaimed approach since its inception. Under the aegis of REACH - Reggio Emilia in Asia for Children that was launched in 2013, EtonHouse has organised nine global conferences, multiple webinars, professional learning sessions and study groups over the years. The first Reggio Children conference in Singapore was held in 2010 and laid the foundation of the collaboration.

Offering a wide array of opportunities such as dialogues, exchanges, research initiatives, study groups, conferences, and publications, among others, this collaboration represents a pivotal moment for early childhood education. The Shanghai conference will also mark the launch of REACH's membership programme, extending to educators and professionals interested in embracing the Reggio Emilia philosophy.

Mr. Ng Yi Xian, Group CEO of EtonHouse, expressed his enthusiasm for the partnership, saying "Our schools have drawn inspiration from the Reggio Emilia approach for many years. Loris Malaguzzi, the founder of the approach said in the 100 languages poem that the child is made of 100, 'a 100 thoughts, a 100 ways of thinking, of playing, of speaking' but the school and adults take away 99. His words have always been an inspiration for us. We celebrate the 100 languages of children in our schools. In 2013, we launched REACH to share this approach with our colleagues in other schools. We organised conferences and annual study groups so that we are all inspired by this transformational approach to teaching and learning. The collaboration will further empower our efforts to share this approach and advocate for best practice to build a better future for our children. We are therefore very grateful for this opportunity to collaborate with Reggio Children in China and Singapore"

About the conference in Shanghai

The conference delegates include 500 educators, leaders and policy makers from China, Singapore, Japan, South Korea and other countries. Renowned education groups participating include the East China Normal University, Nanjing Normal University, Harbin Normal University, Harbin Preschool Teachers College, Heilongjiang Provincial Preschool Education Development Center, Suzhou Early Childhood Education College, Avenues, GCGS, BASIS, Huitong, Pinghe, Gembryo, Dare to Dream, Xiehe, Chiway Education, to name a few.

The speakers at the conference include **Professor Zhu Jiaxiong** a distinguished thought leader in China's education space and one of the earliest scholars to introduce the Reggio Emilia Approach in China.

The speakers from Reggio Emilia are:

Ms. Marina Mori, teacher, with 50 years of experience, she collaborated with Professor Loris Malaguzzi from 1980 to 1993 and taught at the Diana Preschool in Italy for 27 years.

Ms. Paola Strozzi, pedagogista, who worked in the renowned Diana Preschool in Italy for nearly 30 years has rich experiences in the practice, research and professional learning on the Reggio Emilia Approach.

For the first time, the conference will also showcase an art exhibition by the children of the EtonHouse schools titled "Bridging Culture and Space: Dialogues with Time", along with the Global Classroom Project, and a Light Atelier. Created by EtonHouse students from Baitang, Wuzhong, Xiangcheng, Huangqiao, Changshu and Qingjianhu campuses in Suzhou, the art exhibition celebrates the "100 languages" of children and their thinking on the perception of time.
